Description: This class will tackle the world of Storytelling. We will introduce the concept of the conflict, resolution, character, beginning, middle, and end, but above all Creativity. We will use different themes (a few examples – Under the Sea, World Travel, Planets and Stars, Rainbows) under whose umbrella we will explore the vast world of storytelling and adventure through drama, art, teamwork, and music.

English 10/11/12 with SAT Prep

Teacher: Alice Wescott

Age: 15 & up

Cost: \$25 per month;
\$30 per year copy/supply fee

Text: There will be 1-2 textbook(s), which will NOT be ordered until summer. I will order the books so we can get a group discount.

Description: If you are homeschooling under a school, this class will be listed as English 10, 11, or 12. Don't miss out on a scholarship or admission opportunity because your scores were a few points too low! SAT preparation has been shown to significantly improve students' scores, and students who have taken this class in the past have received up to full-tuition scholarships. This class will help the student fully understand the new SAT's reading, writing, and math sections. In addition, we will work on vocabulary, comprehension of literary pieces, and writing skills. Students will be assigned sections of the book to complete each week and then will critically discuss these in class. Test taking strategies will also be worked on. About an hour of outside work will be required each week, but will vary. Class attendance is MANDATORY. NOTE: Running Start students need to take the SAT when transferring to a 4-year college.

Text: Risas y Sonrisas by Spanish for Kids. This is the same text used in Spanish 1. If new to the class, the facilitator will contact you over the summer to place a bulk order. Cost is approximately \$45 plus S&H. This includes a CD-Rom and Skit-CD to listen to at home.

Description: This is a continuation of Spanish 1. We will proceed to build on our reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills developed in Spanish 1 by introducing food, days of the week, months, seasons, animals, school, clothing, personal pronouns, and the conjugation of more verbs in the present, past, and future tenses. Using conventional and total physical response methods we will play games, sing songs, role play, and do constant review. Participation in conversation will be emphasized to develop the student's confidence in his/her ability to communicate in both written and spoken Spanish.

Life Science

Cost: \$30 per month
Text: To Be Determined

Description: A creation-based life science course designed to prepare middle school students for high school science. We will study scientific method, plants, microscopy, classification, animals, the human body, insects, and principles of physical science. Class lab time will include work with microscopes, dissections and more. Students should expect two to three hours per week of homework with both reading assignments and science activities. I believe that science should be fun, easy to understand, and interesting. By the end of the year, I hope the students will be amazed with God's creation and will feel capable of and interested in tackling more advanced science coursework.

Open Study Hall

Description: This is the only study hall available on Mondays. If a student is not enrolled in a class, they need to be in this room or in their car with their parent. Philosophy attempts to answer these questions, and it is the young who best ask them. These books are great or good because the authors have cleverly written with style and clarity stories that search out the answer to those childlike questions. Healthy Habits for Girls

Teacher: Sharon Duguay
Age: 11 - 14
Cost: \$20 per month;
\$25 per year material fee

Description: Fun and fellowship are powerful tools in the learning experience. This class is all about building friendships while developing healthy habits in the areas of fitness, nutrition, hygiene, and safety. We will spend about half of the class period doing physical activity; stretching, walking, learning new skills, and activities. Students should come prepared, wearing appropriate shoes and clothing. Students will have the opportunity to participate in the President's Challenge sponsored by the President's Council on Physical Fitness. The remainder of the class will be spent doing a variety of activities as we address healthy habits in the areas of injury prevention, bicycle safety, water safety, sports participation, daily routines, healthy snacks, family activities, and so forth. As for homework, students will set up their own weekly exercise/activity plans and keep a fitness record and journal. There will also be reading assignments in the form of journal articles and handouts as well as activities relevant to the weekly topic. Students should plan on 30 minutes per day 5 days a week for implementing their exercise program and another 60-90 minutes per week for other homework assignments. Description: The Judeo-Christian worldview is predominantly responsible for the form of government we enjoy in the United States. Being an informed participant in our country's political system is not only a requirement for good citizenship but should also help the student to uphold Biblical standards in and for our country. We will study the U.S. political system and government emphasizing the U.S. Constitution and its application to modern political issues. The Washington State Constitution and government will be compared and contrasted with our federal constitution and government. This course is designed as a full year's class to meet both U.S. Government and "senior issues" graduation requirements. Each student will have at least 3-4 hours of homework per week. Although this course is not an AP course as defined by the College Board, the subject matter of the course will follow the College Board's U. S. Government and Politics AP test outline in order to assist students who desire to take that AP test. Verbal participation in class is mandatory and is designed to improve each student's ability to

express him/herself with clarity and in a respectful manner. Grading will be based on this classroom participation as well as weekly written assignments, tests, and a detailed essay each semester. Homework will consist primarily of reading and writing assignments but verbal reports or speeches about contemporary issues facing our government will also be included, as will specific civics assignments.

Biology Starts at 8:30

Prerequisite: General Science and Physical Science preferred but not required. The ability to read, write, and comprehend information at the 9th grade level.

Description: This course emphasizes God's creative design that is so evident in living things. We will study the science of biology and the classification of living things. In separate modules we will learn about chemistry, cells, cellular reproduction, genetics, ecosystems, and creation vs. evolution. The five major kingdoms are studied individually with one module each for Monera, Protista, and Fungi, four modules devoted to animals and one to plants. There are many hands-on experiments which will include the use of microscopes and dissections of prepared specimens. This is an intensive study which will prepare students for college level classes. Students will be expected to read 20-25 pages of text, complete study guides, quizzes and lab notebook entries for each module (chapter). Two weeks will be allotted to each module. This class fulfills the requirement for a high school lab science.

Integrated Arts

Cost: \$25 per month;

Description: We will combine Art and Words, while developing our God-given creative gifts. With excursions into drawing, painting, cartooning, ceramic tile glazing, ceramic sculpting, mosaic, and others. We will use the principles of Design and Color to make exciting visual statements that reveal our inner artist. Parental help is welcome for occasional simple written-word assignments to be paired with the art projects or illustrated with drawings. The end result is your student's imagination, captured in precious heirloom keepsakes and a whole lot of artistic fun! Frequent hallway art shows share the students' artistic visions with their peers. Students work to the level of their ability. Possibly 1-2 hours homework weekly, depending on the project. Small mid-year engraving fee for the mosaic. (Older students welcome with teacher permission.) Supply fees cover all in-class supplies: paper, pens, colored pencils, oil pastels, markers, matboards, ceramic tiles, glazes, frames, clay, clay supplies, clay and tools, firing fees, mosaic supplies, acrylic paints, brushes, paper towels, and other miscellaneous supplies. At-home art supplies are assumed: basic pencils, colored pencils, markers, and the ability to print-up a writing off of a computer.

Jr High Drama Technique
